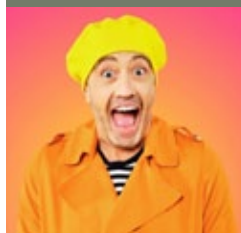

Almost 15 years ago, award-winning saxophonist Karen Sharp formed her quartet with three other superstars of the UK jazz scene: Nikki Iles (piano), Dave Green (bass) and Steve Brown (drums). The group have recorded two CDs which showcase a shared passion for strong melodies, group interplay and respect for the jazz tradition.

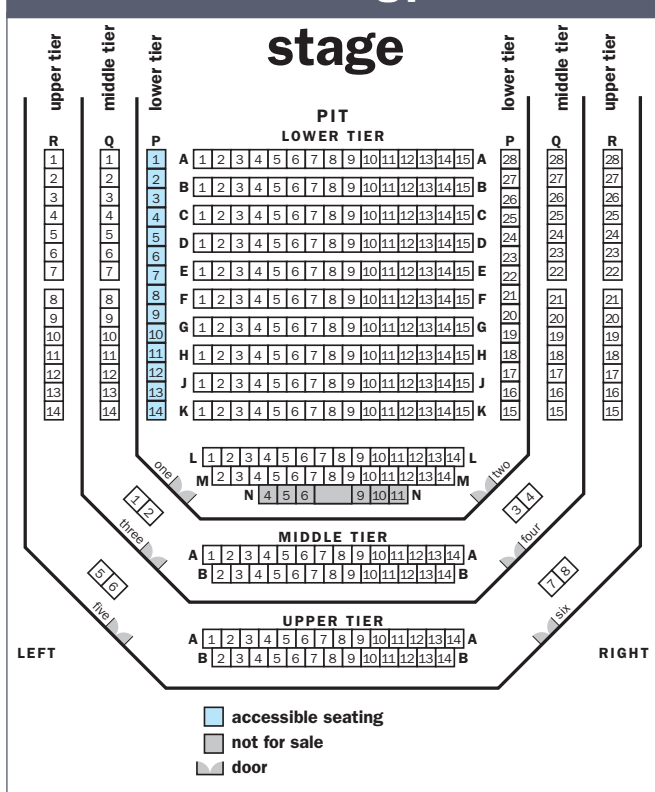

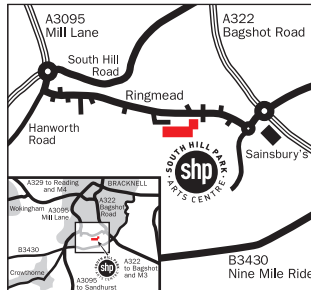

How to find us

South Hill Park Arts Centre is about seven minutes' drive from Bracknell Town Centre in the Birch Hill area. Easily accessible from the M3 (Junction 3) and M4 (Junction 10). We are very well signposted – look for the brown road signs saying 'Arts Centre' or showing a comedy mask.



By car

There is FREE but limited parking for 200 cars at South Hill Park Arts Centre. Please note the car park fills up quickly on busy days and you may need to seek alternative parking.

Please follow signs for overflow parking at the Leppington car park (behind Birch Hill shopping precinct) which is a five-minute walk across our rear grounds. Please leave plenty of time to park when attending South Hill Park.

Public transport
