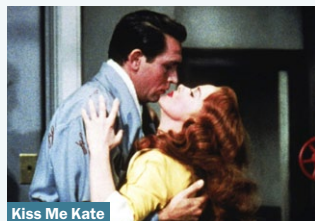

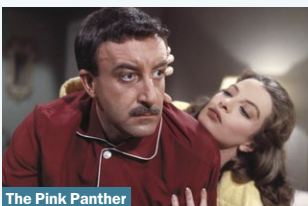


The Pink Panther

Five-time Olivier Award winner Imelda Staunton joins forces with her real-life daughter Bessie Carter for the very first time, playing mother and daughter in Bernard Shaw's incendiary moral classic. This new production reunites Staunton with director Dominic Cooke (*Follies*, *Good*), exploring the clash between morality and independence, traditions and progress.
