We also celebrate 40 years of *The Comedy Cellar*, the longest running comedy club outside London that has launched the careers of many international comedians (see page 15). If you are yet to venture into the cellar, beneath the South Hill Park mansion, I would highly recommend a visit.

And don't forget our intimate and ornate cinema, only 60 seats, with screenings every week, including monthly dementia-friendly screenings. You can also take part in a diverse range of courses and one-off workshops for all tastes and abilities.

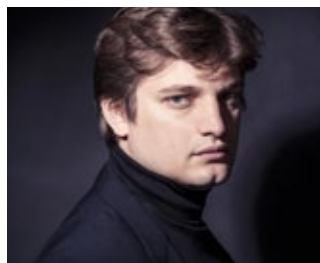

The repertoire features radical reworkings of classic jazz tunes from the likes of Miles Davis, Thelonious Monk and Paul Motian, as well as several of Martin's own evocative compositions.



Mark Bassey

Jazz trombonist Mark Bassey has been described as 'a superb, witty player' (Dave Gelly). His playing can stretch from the 'raucous' (John Fordham) to an 'exquisite sound and perfect phrasing' (Brian Blain). Mark is a highly versatile musician who can be heard in many different guises, playing with Alan Barnes, Julian Arguelles, Nikki Iles, recently with Billy Jenkins and the BBC Big Band, and also at Ronnie Scott's with Liane Carroll.

Nat Steele is an internationally known jazz vibraphonist and recording artist who specialises in playing straight ahead, swinging jazz, unashamedly influenced by players like Milt Jackson and Cal Tjader. He has worked extensively around the UK with renowned musicians like Grant Stewart, Ralph Moore, Alan Broadbent and Scott Hamilton – who features on Nat's most recent album. He has been described by Clark Tracey as 'one of the best vibes players this country has ever produced.'

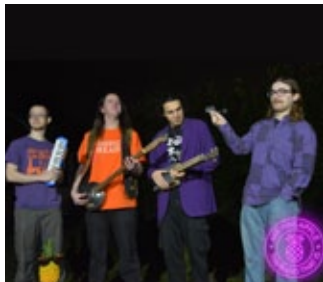

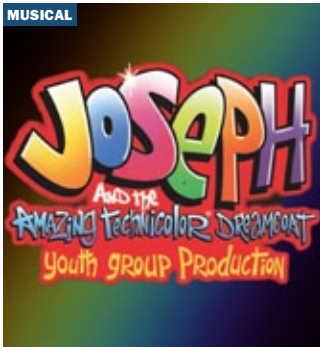

Are you a young carer?

A young carer is someone under 18yrs who cares for a friend or family member who, due to illness, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction, cannot cope without their support.

What might a young carer do?

- Practical tasks, like cooking, housework and shopping
- Physical care, such as helping someone out of bed
- Emotional support, including talking to someone who is distressed
- Personal care, such as helping someone dress
- Managing the family budget and collecting prescriptions
- Helping to give medicine
- Helping someone communicate
- Looking after brothers and sisters.

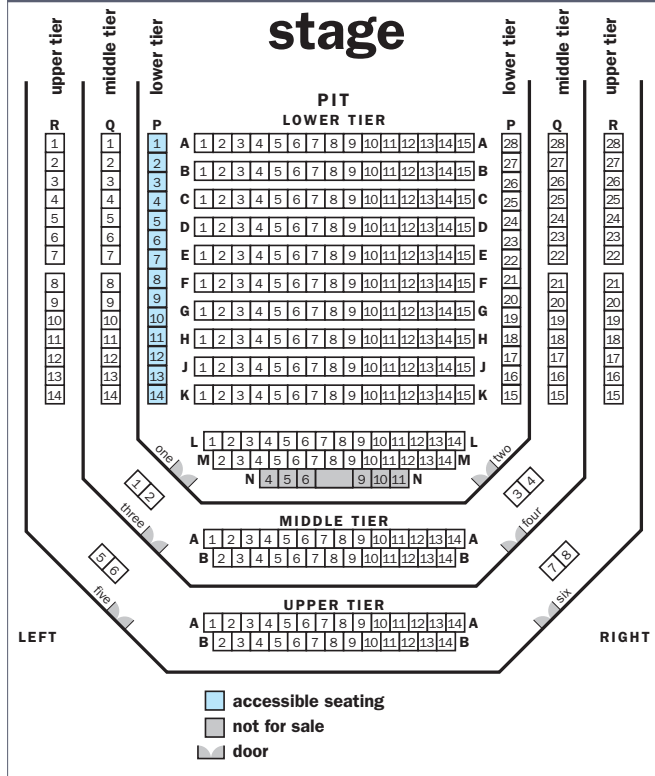

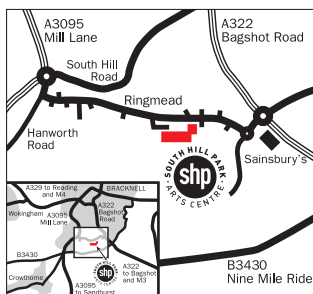

Mobility scooters are not permitted in performance spaces. However, we do have a wheelchair that our customers can use to transfer into their purchased seats. Please inform Box Office when booking so they can assign you the most suitable seats for your needs.
